
## Mental Arithmetic Bingo

To play this game you will need a whiteboard or a piece of paper, a pen or pencil and 4 dice.

Split your whiteboard (or paper) into a 5x5 grid and write a number between 0 and 20 in each box. You can use the same number more than once. Roll your 4 dice and use the numbers that you've rolled to create one of the numbers on your grid. You can calculate answers using



subtraction, addition, multiplication, division, or any combination of these but each number rolled can only be used once. Once you've created a number from your grid, cover it with a counter, rub it out or put a mark on the grid to show which number you've made. Try to create all the numbers in a row or a column at first, and then continue playing until you've created all of the numbers on your grid.

For variations of this game, play with a partner and take turns to create a number from the same grid; try to be the first to complete a row of 5 (a bit like Noughts & Crosses). When you're playing with a partner you can also try having a grid per player and, for an added speed element to the game, give each player their own 4 dice and both play at once: the winner is the first player to have created all of the numbers on their grid from the numbers that they've rolled.
